- provide for workstation and user data security;
- install hardware and perform its basic maintenance, choose components and integrate them into computers;
- monitor the operation and rectify minor errors on networks, hardware and software;
- archive and protect databases;
- design forms and reports.

In addition, the holder of the certificate also upgraded his/her key professional skills and competences with key general knowledge and skills in line with national standards.

The holder of the certificate can find employment at:

- work units with computers or other computer peripheral devices;
