- use workshop documentation and implement plans autonomously;
- handle material and work resources appropriately;
- tailor, cut, staple and use the upholstery material economically;
- make high-quality upholstery products for sitting and lying furniture as well as upholstery equipment for vehicles;
- make high-quality textile products for interior furnishing and install them;
- maintain and restore upholstery products of low and raised padding;
- use the basic information communication technology.

In addition, the holder of the certificate also upgraded his/her key professional skills and competences with key general knowledge and skills in line with national standards.

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The holder of the certificate can find employment at:

- timber industry where upholstery products for indoor furniture are made;
- workshops where interior fittings with various types of textiles are made and installed;
- workshops where upholstery products for cars and other means of transport are made;
- craft industry where upholstered furniture is made for individual orders.
