- advise clients about the purchase and maintenance of tyres and rims, and about vehicle repair and maintenance works;
- master teamwork and cooperate well with co-workers, experts, clients;
- communicate with co-workers, experts, clients and use the appropriate professional terminology;
- use energy, materials, work resources and time rationally, economically and carefully in order to protect the environment;

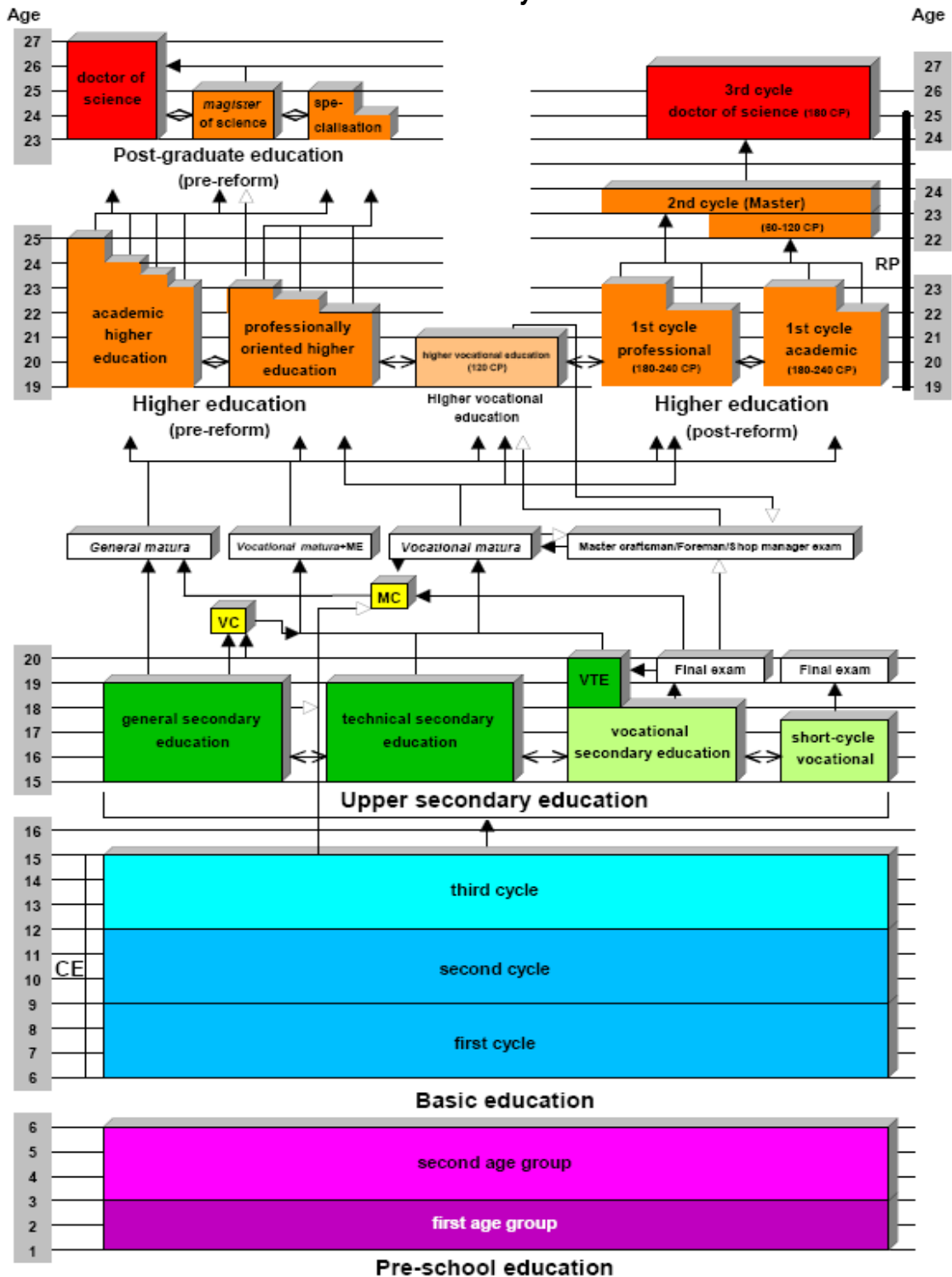
