#### 3. ACQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCES

The holder of the certificate is qualified to:

- plan, manage and monitor work in forest production and activities;
- conduct high-quality work and tasks pertaining to forest growing and protection, provide for the performance of ecological and social functions in forests and forest nurseries;
- prepare high-quality wildlife management plans;
- market forest and timber products;
- elaborate high-quality logging ad harvesting plans, monitor works at forest sites and keep records of the work done;
- responsibly manage forests and obtain dendrometric parameters;
- use forest machinery and installations by taking into account safe work procedures;
- cooperate in a group, be capable of written and oral communication with co-workers, experts and clients by employing basic forestry terms;
- communicate with co-workers, clients and other entities for the purposes of work organisation, and conduct other tasks in relation to problem resolution:
- use state of the art ICT for communication, planning, organisation, economically viable work and work procedures in the professional field;
- protect and rationally use natural resources, energy and raw materials when performing forestry works;

#### .Optional:

- select, sort and machine timber and semi-manufactured products as well as work timber cutting machines intended for primary timber processing;
- be capable of high-quality planning procedures in logging and harvesting of forest tree range of varieties;
- grow seeds and produce forest tree seedlings;
- be familiar with forest flora and fauna, and forest landscape ecosystems.

In addition, the holder of the certificate also upgraded his/her key professional skills and competences with key general knowledge and skills in line with national standards.

#### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

companies involved in forestry activity, tree nurseries, national and landscape parks, farms.
