3. ACQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCES

The holder of the certificate is qualified to:

- plan and organise his/her own work;
- perform wood works by bearing in mind safety at work;
- conduct removal, process wood and make trunk patterns;
- haul and collect range of varieties and work in the ramp area;
- log and harvest wood under special circumstances and in emergency situations;
- maintain forest functions, forest traffic routes and small watercourses;
- maintain manual tools, motor saws and aids for work in forests and tree nurseries;
- cooperate in a group and communicate with co-workers;
- employ ICT for searching, processing and assessing data in his/her work;
- act responsibly at worplace by providing for one's own safety and protecting the environment;

Optional:

- select, sort and work wood and semi-manufactured goods by using machines as well as shred logs by using primary woodworking machines;
- conduct controls and monitor the status of wildlife in the hunting district;
- produce, convert and keep seeds as well as produce seedlings of woody plants.

In addition, the holder of the certificate also upgraded his/her key professional skills and competences with key general knowledge and skills in line with national standards.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The holder of the certificate can find employment at:

- forest companies;
- tree nurseries or farms.


